## **KANSAS CITY FED ANNOUNCES OFFICER PROMOTION AND APPOINTMENTS**

The following promotion and officer appointments were recently announced by Esther George, president and chief executive officer of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City:

**Josias Aleman** has been promoted to senior vice president and general auditor. He assumes responsibility for the Bank's internal audit function and will report directly to the Audit Committee of the Bank's Board of Directors. Aleman, who joined the Bank's Oklahoma City Branch Office in 1994, most recently served as vice president of the Human Resources Department, a position he held since 2010. Previously, he was assistant vice president and assistant general auditor and has held various positions in the Bank's Check Services, Facilities Management and Accounting and Securities departments. He holds a bachelor's degree in economics and an MBA with emphasis in finance and human resources, both from the University of Oklahoma. He is also a graduate of the Stonier Graduate School of Banking and is a certified internal auditor.

**Melissa Jackson** has been appointed assistant vice president and public information officer in the Bank's Public Affairs Department. Jackson joined the Bank in 2006 and has held roles in Facilities Management and Public Affairs, most recently as staff manager with responsibility for the Bank's Kansas City Money Museum as well as Public Affairs marketing, business operations and electronic communication initiatives. She holds a bachelor's degree in organizational communication from Missouri State University and is pursuing a Master's in Public Administration from the University of Kansas.

**Adam Winzenried** has been appointed assistant vice president in the Bank's Information Technology Division. In this role, Winzenried will have responsibility for strategic planning and administrative and communication functions in the Federal Reserve's National IT End User Services organization. He will also provide oversight for the IT Division's program management and communications team. Winzenried joined the Bank's Savings Bonds Department in 2003 and has held several staff and supervisory roles in the Bank's financial services and technology areas. He has a bachelor's degree in business administration from Washburn University.
